MINOR PERMISSION SLIP POLICY

Definition of a Minor

Minor n. someone under legal age, which is generally 18.

Permission Slip Drafting

Traveling with minors must be conducted in accordance to local and national law to protect the health and legal rights of both the minor that is traveling and Bethesda Baptist Church. Any time a trip is taken as an event of Bethesda Baptist Church, or outreach of Bethesda Baptist Church, proper forms must be filled out prior to departure that will correspond to the destination, departure dates, and return dates of the trip being taken. The trip leader must meet with the Church Office in advance and arrange to give the trip details to the Administrative Assistant so that proper permission slips can be drawn up in a timely manner to suit the needs of the trip being taken.

Each trip will have specific details that can not be covered under a single generic form; therefore, Bethesda Baptist Church establishes the policy that each trip will have a specific form generated to cater specifically to each trip's needs as they are taken in the future.

The Church Office must be given ample time to draw up the applicable release forms for each trip, and all trip leaders must take this into consideration when planning events that include minors traveling with them. This includes but is not limited to: Youth camps, Youth Rallies, Conferences, Missions Trip in State, Missions Trips in the USA, and Missions trips outside of the USA.
